For a limited time, when you include Johns Hopkins University and Medicine in your estate plans or make a qualified life income gift, a portion of your planned gift will be matched with an immediate gift to the program or department of your choice.

What is the Johns Hopkins Legacy Match?

The Johns Hopkins Legacy Match is a way for us to honor our first 150 years as we recognize and reward those who help secure our future with a gift from their estate or a life income gift by matching a portion of their planned gift with a gift that provides immediate support to a program or department of their choosing.

What types of gifts qualify for the Johns Hopkins Legacy Match?

Gifts made through a <u>will or trust</u> or by <u>beneficiary designation</u> and life income gifts, such as <u>charitable gift annuities</u> and <u>charitable remainder unitrusts</u>, all qualify for the Johns Hopkins Legacy Match.

What portion of my legacy gift will be matched?

Matching gifts will equal 10% of the full value of your estate gift or life income gift, up to \$25,000.

Can I direct the matching gift to support a different department or program than my legacy gift?

Yes, the matching gift can support any area of Johns Hopkins.

Is there a time limit to qualify for a matching gift?

Yes, matching funds are limited and available to legacy donors on a first-documented, first-matched basis. Matching gifts will be available through the end of our sesquicentennial year (Dec. 31, 2026) or until all matching funds have been claimed, whichever comes first.

How do I ensure my legacy gift qualifies for the Johns Hopkins Legacy Match?

Contact the Office of Gift Planning to speak with a gift planning advisor, who will work to understand your financial and philanthropic goals and determine if your gift qualifies.
